Dr Gilbert also shares his cell number for emergency situations for existing patients and pediatric patients.

Harrison, Amy (accepted by Carine Wood)

Amy qualified in 2000 as well as completing her Masters degree. She is the co-owner of a very successful multi-disciplinary private practice in Johannesburg with a special interest in neurology rehabilitation. She recently expanded their business in starting the Phila Sonke Wellness Initiative as a non-profit, hybrid social enterprise which operates from a wellness center at the Dobsonville Stadium in Soweto and therefore enhancing the physiotherapy profession's standing in the community through a Public-Private Partnership model. They fund out-patient Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech Therapy, through private rehabilitation service providers, to clients with temporary and/or permanent illnesses and injuries. The funded services include Neurorehabilitation, Amputee Rehabilitation, Vestibular Rehabilitation, Oncology Rehabilitation, Vocational Rehabilitation, Return-To-Driving programs, Dysphagia Therapy and Musculoskeletal Rehabilitation.

hearX Group (accepted by Tanya Boretti)

hearX is an organisation whose mission is Affordable access to hearing care using smart digital health solutions that anyone can use, anywhere. hearX have developed and launched several products providing hearing healthcare access to the masses. Their HearZa app was rolled out through SA providing individuals the ability to assess their hearing by downloading an app for free to test their hearing independently. If a hearing loss is identified the individual is referred to an audiologist for further assessment and treatment.

hearX also launched the Hear screen app which was used to provide hearing testing to rural communities through SA. Most of these communities had no previous access to hearing healthcare.
